the best way to take the paint of the screws so 1 may

ANSWER: First stick masking tape all around the screws to proThen cover each nail head with a dab of paste paint remover, and
give it time to soften the paint. Then rub off the paint with stee)
wool moistened with turpentine. If you do not wish to buy paint re-
mover for such a small job, moisten a little trisodium phosphate
and put it on the screw heads, let. ting it stay there until the paint
