Four new employes have been added to the force now employed by the Ballinger office. three operators and one toll ticket clerk.

Last month the increase in subscribers to the local exchange was 17 new phones. This runs the total number of telephones in service here up to 835, more probably per capita than any other town in West Texas. The increase this month in regular subscribers is expected to go beyond the last months' list easily.


