3 Business Houses And Post Office

Safecrackers made a haul of ap
proximately $\$ 1,100$ here last Fri day night when they entered the post office and three business post of
The post office reported about 8464 taken and Carbon Trading Co. about $\$ 550$. Two other places, Carbon Drug Co. and Ben Stephenson's Grocery, were entered but owners have not discovered anything missing.
J. B. Williams, sheriff of Eastland County, was here early Satand County, was here early Saturday morning with one of
deputies and a Texas Ranger deputies and a Texas Ranger,
Johnny Cope, from Breckenridge to investigate the robberies. Sheriff Williams also notified United States Postal authorities who arrived here Saturday afternoon.
The burglaries were discovered early Saturday morning when Hoyle Reed, an employe of Car bon Trading Co., came to work and on entering the store smelled tear gas from the knob of the safo which had been knocked off.
Meredith Black, a clerk in the post office, stated that the knob had been knocked from the safe and the currency and change takon but the money or'ers were nu taken. Entrance had been gained taken. Entrath had been gained hrough a south side window, after the protective screen had been
ripped away. ripped away.
The culprits entered the Carbon Drug Store through the front door and indications were that they left out through the back loor by prieing it open with large two-by-four. E. R. Yar brough, owner, states that he has not discovered any valuables missing, however much of the merchandise was "'rewn over the floor.

New Type Sharpener Usable in Fields Will Sharpen Mower Blade While on Bar
A new type of hay mower blade sharpener which makes it possibe
to sharpen the ordinary mower sec tion right in the field without even
removing it to removing it from the cutter bar,
thus saving time and labor and thus saving time and labor and
making it possible to cut more hay faster, has been placed on the market by the New England Carbide


The black tip of this new type mower blade sharpener is made of carboloy cemented carbide,
hardest metal commercially available. Mower blades can be sharpened quickly and easily in the field with this sharpener.
The sharpener consists of a stee shank one-half inch square and rust and having rounded edges so that the tool can be carried safely in the pocket. The tip which does
the actual sharpening is made of the actual sharpening is made
ultra-hard carboloy cemented car uitra-hard carboioy cemen
bide metal, which is atta
curely to the steel shank.
To sharpen mower blades with this "carbide tipped" tool, the edges of the blade to be sharpened are
uncovered. The sharpener is held in the hand, palm down. The carboloy tip is placed on the mower blade at about a thirty-degree angle
and drawn from back to front on the blade three or four times. This pro duces an extremely sharp edge.
Any small burr which may develop on the blade may be removed by
drawing the carbide tip across the

Never approach a horse without speaking to him.
As a rule, farmers do not con-
sider horses as especially dan sider hors animals, yet they account
gerous
for more for more accidents of a serious
nature than any other farm animal nature than any other farm animal.
According to the National Safety Council, approximately three times as many accidents occur with
as maproximatey three times
horses as with any other farm animal. Farmers should always be cautious around these animals, the
NSC continued. One phase of this precaution is a through check in
the spring of all equipment to be the spring of all equipment to be harness.
Only strong harness should be regularly and kept in good repai Dry leather has low tensile strength and it should be cleaned with mild soap and warm water and treated
with oil. Attention to equipment such as neck-yokes, tongues, single-
trees, double-trees and eveners is also very necessary. The NSC suggests that many seri-
ous farm accidents can be prevented ous farm accidents can be prevente
by following these simple rules: Never approach a horse withou speaking to him. When cleaning a stall, make no sudden movement. Enter the stall on the left side of
the horse. When driving or leading horses, never wrad the lines around body.
