This club was organized to work for the betterment of Carbon and community and all men who interested are urged to be present.

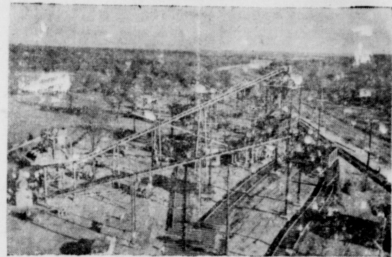
## Methodists To Have Vacation Bible School

## Now Drilling On Day Tract

Ellenburger production is being sought 1 1/4 miles northeast of Carbon on the Day tract. C. H. Murphy & Company of Eldorado, Ark. are having the well drilled by Frank Lane, drilling contractor of Wichita Falls. The well was spudded in last Saturday and they are now drilling at about 1900 ft and hope to get to the Ellenburger pay within the next few days.

## New Rock Crusher Plant

## Crusher Plant Running Near Full Capacity

The Concrete Materials and Construction Company, with head quarters at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is now running near full capacity at their large rock crusher on the C. S. Eldridge farm 1 mile east of Carbon. The plant is furnishing rock for the Whitney Dam and is now crushing around 50 cars a day, also limestone and what is available for the farmers to be used as a soil builder.

They employ at this time about 75 men which means a large payroll that helps to stimulate business in this community. Leroy Ramer, plant superintendent, states that this plant will be in operation for several years. The company has several plants in operation in different states, but this is the largest and most modern plant owned by the company. The M. K. & T. railroad has charge of the transportation of the rock to the Whitney Dam and extra train crews are being used to fulfill their contract.

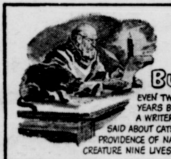

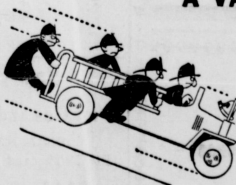
