



Washington, May 10 .- An official cablegram received here from France today confirms the report that Pesident Wilson will now allow Italy to have Fiume.

Paris May 10.-The Italian difficulty is as far from settlement as ever, according to the French press, which asserts that President Wilson maintains his position and it is not believed he will depart from it in the slightest. He has not adheared it is said to the proposed compromise by which Italy would administer Fiume as manda tory of the League of Nations until 1923, after which Fiume would revert to the Italian sovereignty, the Jugo-Slavs being given a port a few miles lower down the Ad riatic coast.

The impression in France conference circles is that Italy is tem porarily abandoning her claim to Fiume and will exact full execution of the pact of London.

London, May 10 .- An Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Berlin, says that after a fice hours session of the German cabinet. Thursday Philip Scheidemann, the chancellor, delivered a speech to the committee appointed to consider the treaty. 

### CHARGED WITH POISONING HUSBAND

Mrs. Anna Cook, wife of Oscar look, who returned to his home in Kent county from the army a few days ago, and who a few days later died from the effects of a dose of poison, has not been released from the Asperment jail, where she is held charged with poisoning her husband, according to the Abilene Reporter.

The case is one of unusual interest. The defendant who is only seventeen years of age, was married to Oscar Cook about three weeks before his death and lived with him at his brother's home near Girard. Before her marriage she was Miss Anna Yarnell, daugh ter of Mr. and Mrs. S, Yarnell, who have resided in Kent county a number of years. Cook was twenty-three years old and had recently returned from the army. According to Judge Stinson, Mrs

Cook gives about the following as the facts connected with the death of her husband:

On Friday before the death she alleges that Cook gave her money with which to buy some strychnine to kill wolves and dogs and she went to Girard and purchased same and gave it to her husband that day upon her return home. On Monday she went to Girard and purchased some capsules which she wanted to use in taking quinine. She says that she took three doses of quinine and that on Tuesday afternoon her husband asked to be given a dose as he was feeling bad; that she went to the box that contained the capsules she had been taking and got one for herself and one for her husband and they each took a capsule. Her husband then went to the lot and milked the cow, returning in about thirty minutes very sick. She called his brother and they together got him out of the storm celler where she and




