Rabbit Seemed to Enjoy Powerful Electric Shock.

Experiment Recently Made Shows Great Possibilities in This Form of Treatment for Toning Up the Nervous System.

Watching two boys amusing themselves by jumping on and off a third rail on Long Island recently, H. Gernsback, editor of the Electrical Experimenter, wondered what would happen if he were to stand on the pole of a very powerful Tesla coil. He went to where there is one of the electrical testing laboratories, where there is one of the most powerful high frequency machines in the country, giving 500,-000 volts and using 20 kilowatts. 
