BREAKING THE RAIN RECORD

If rain does not fall before the end of the month, the record for April rain fall in this country will be shattered. The average rainfall for the past twenty-five years for the month of April is 2.69, and for the past twenty-five years only six years show less than one inch of rain for April, as follows:

Year 1897 1902

A dry April does not indicate dry year, for the record shows that the annual rainfall for the dry April years was above the average, with the exception of 1897 when only 18.61 inches fell, 1907 when 18.44 inches fell and 1909 when 17 inches fell.

The best crops ever made in the county were made on May plantings, following a lack of rain for planting in April. With the splendid underground season a good rain within the next two weeks would pave the way for another bumper erop.
