# **COTTON GIN FIGURES DOUBLE LAST YEAR**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 .- Cotton ginned prior to Sept. 1st, this year, amounted to 367,241 running bales, including 21,143 round bales, the department of census announced today in making public its first ginning report for the season.

Cotton ginned to the same date last season amounted to 142,-625 bales, including 1,118 round bales, and 26 bales of Sea Island cotton.

The report by states for this year shows that Texas has ginned 344,019 bales of the total amount ginned.


