The day's disorders, which ac ded to the appalling chapter of the Irish tragedy enacted in th island for the past several months began with what was apparent a deliberate shooting in wh fourteen men, mostly military of ficers, were killed. During the afternoon the Irish constabulary in "black and tan" raided a fo ball game. The melee resulted in at least ten persons being killed.
