# LUBBOCK BOYS CONFESS ALLIES REJECT TERMS; YEGGS ROB 2 STATIONS; TO KILLING OF OPERATOR

LUBBOCK, Tex., Feb. 25.—J. Edgar Craft, age twenty-two, telegraph operator at the local Santa Fe passenger station, was shot and instantly killed at four o'clock this morning by two ban-

The young man was shot down in cold blood in the presence of Express Agent Pinkerton and Deputy Sheriff Murphy, after repeatedly telling the bandits that he did not know the combination to the safe and was unable to open it, and after pleading with the bandits not to kill him.

The two witnesses were forced to stand with their hands up while they looked on and saw Craft shot to death because he could not open the safe for the bandits.

The bandits escaped. Scouting parties are scouring the country and feeling is running high.
