'Hog-Wallow's Sample' Of County's Many Soils

"HOG-WALLOW" SOIL By Joe Moore SCS Office

Eastland County has 50 different kinds of suf, and of those 50, Tobosa clay stands as a distinct individual Although it is of fairly sman fextent, approximately 15,000 acres, it is priculturally importnat to Eastland County.

Tobosa soils are high shrinkswell clay soils. When the soil is dry, it shrinks, causing cracked about 1 inch wide and 20 inches deep. When it becomes wet, the clay swella. The end result is an area of "hog wallows". No other soil in Eastland County has such a high co-efficient of expansion and contraction with changes in moisture. Buildings, highways or practically anything built on this soil is likely to be damage because of the wisting and turning of the "hog walls" soil.

Tobosa clay is imported because of it's ability to seil-mulch and also because it pertically always "lays good". It occurs in broad valleys with flat to gentle slopes. It usually receives additional moisture as runoff from other soils at high-

er elevations. This soil is high in natural fertility. It is calcare ous or high in free lime. It is very platic and striky when wet, causing tillage problems. It takes in water rapidly when dry, but when the cracks close, the water enters very slowly. It has a high water holding capacity but also has a high wilting coint.

Tobosa soils are especially adapted to small grain and grain sorghum. Alfalfa is also well adapted. The main himitation on the flat areas is on plant root deph. Water erosion is the mean hazard on the more sloping areas. Rangeland areas support a dense stand of Texas wintergrass, buffalograss, and other short grasses. White tridens usually grow in the "hog wallows," of depressions with the short grasses growing on the low knotts. As the picture shows mesquite trees are usually present unless controlled.
