



Check up on your soil fertility "bank account." It's more important to you than the number of dollars you have in your commercial ac-count.

Your present and future prosper-ity depends on your soll's crop pro-ducing ability. Crop producing abil-ity, in turn, depends on the size of your soil fertility bank account-how you match deposits and with-drawals.

Every crop you sell carries with nitrogen, phosphate, potash and



other plant nutrients. Unless you balance these withdrawals with good management "deposits" that replace nutrients, rebuild organic matter and repair damaged soil structure, your soil bank account will be overdrawn.

will be overdrawn. Among steps recommended for keeping your soll bank solvent are: Use deep-rooted legumes regularly in the rotation. Apply lime on the basis of soil tests. Use commercial fertilizer containing phosphate and plash as needed. Return manure, corn stalks, straw and other crop other and the other base contour nethods where necessary.
