

There is no law in Texas by means of which the railroad company can be compelled to bear a portion of the cost of eliminating railroad crossings over public highways.

The state laws confer no power on the raliroad commission to declare a railroad grade crossing over a highway a menace and dangerous to human life and to order that it be eliminated by relocation or by means of an under pass or an over pass.

There is no power other than that which would acrue thru condemnation proceedings in the
