

ARDMORE, Okla., Jan. 29 .-Jeff'Smith and J. D. Smith, two of the defendants arraigned for trial here today in the masked band killing, were granted severances on motion of the defense

ARDMORE, Okla., Jan. 29.-A demurrer to sufficiency of eviwell known Carter county zens, charged with murder as the result of alleged operations of a masked band near here in December 1921, is expected to be the first move the defense will make when the trial of the men starts here today. It is also indicated that the defense will ask for a severance of the cases.

The charges against the followed the killing of Joe Carrell at his home near Wilson, Oklahome, when the members of his family fired on the band. John Smith, of Wilson, was later found mortally wounded, and G. (Sims, of Ardmore, a detective was found dead in a pasture th next day.

A number of the defendant claim that they have been charged with the murder because of the fight they had been waging a gainst Buck Garrett, who was later ousted as sheriff with other county officials for lax law enorcement.
