## University Bone 'Bank' Reduces Amputation Cases

"bank" in the medical center at the University of Kansas has prevented several amputations and speeded
the recovery of many patients. It is a system of preserving hu man bone sections in a deep-treeze unit until needed in surgery and was set up by Dr. James Weaver, head
of the department of orthopedics. Bone sections ranging from tiny tragments to plieces eight inches
