## W. C. Reynolds Makes Another Statement to Voters

There should be an office in Gorman as it is the central city, open 8 hours a day, six days a week, 12 months a year. This office would be used to keep the public informed through a prepared statement and an itemized account of every dollar received, every dollar spent and what was accomplished by the expenditure. This should be publicized in your local paper at least quarterly, if not monthly. This office can assist in the collection of taxes saving many miles of travel to Eastland.

There should be regular meetings in every community with your commissioner presiding over the meetings to discuss the needs of the community such as roads, terraces, bridges and soil conservation. Next comes the equipment and machinery to take care of this work. Also this work should be done on an absolute cost basis to the public, you would be surprised how quick this equipment could pay for itself, then every farmer could afford to have this work done. "A picture frozen on duty— A mother tressed for her brood— Staring, blinking, the Jewick— And Jesus on the road."

WE GET the first draught of this tonic in verses 8-9, 14-15 and 17. "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's meat, nor with the wine which he drank."



He was brave enough to take a stand for what he knew was right. This reminds me of the story told of Henry Ward Beecher, when yet a small boy. A teacher in the school he attended asked a boy a question which he promptly answered.

DARE TO STAND ALONE DANIEL knew that he was taking an unpopular position, but he was willing to be alone so long as he knew he was right.

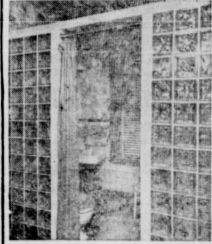

Water produced by the autos in this country in the form of vapors from the exhaust annually amounts to 17 1/2 billion gallons, or enough to fill a canal 25 feet wide and 6 feet deep running between New York and San Francisco.

Friends, we in precinct two obtain our existence through and from the soil, either through crops poultry or livestock and when you drive over the country and see so many farms with practically all the soil gone you can't help but wonder where the money is going to come from to keep up our institutes of learning, our county welfare and civic organizations.

Folks, time and tide wait for no man, therefore it is absolutely your responsibility in the selection of a man to act as your commissioner one capable of taking care of your interests, both in Eastland and everywhere your interest becomes involved.

Then taking our roads into consideration, folks, I wish to remind you there are places in our precinct that haven't had one dollar spent on roads or maintenance in 15 or 20 years, yet we claim to be democratic and I want to say to you now that you cannot be democratic and not have a feeling of responsibility toward your neighbors and your neighboring communities. Do you think you could get one of the ex-commissioners to explain to the public just why this very grave situation has lingered on for some 25 years or more since our commissioner form of government has been established. I will tell you just how bad this situation is in this zone in harvest time or any other time. People living one or two miles apart would have to travel 8 to 12 miles to visit or help his neighbor with not a connecting road for some 9 miles and this isn't the only place that has been neglected, if you will just investigate you can find several more though I think this is the worst one.
