Tri-County Show Of Livestock Has Been Postponed

The Tri-County Livestock Show which was scheduled to be held in Ranger last week end, was postponed on account of bad weather and will be held Friday and Saturday of this week. The program will be the same as previously planned except the appearance of Murray Cox, who will be unable to come due to other engagements.

Feb. 20 and 21 are the dates set for the show which will be held in the Jaycees new native stone show barn adjacent to the rodeo arena. Prior entries are not being requested except in the horse division, but all horse exhibitors must register in advance. George Campbell, supt. of the horse division, will handle the registration of horses, and may be contacted at the Ranger Farm Equipment store.

Over \$500.00 are being offered in the various classes including beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry and horses.

All animals must be in their places at 11 a. m. Friday. At 1 p. m. the animals will be sifted, and at 3:00 p. m. poultry will be judged, and Saturday morning at 9 o'clock judging of horses will take place. Goat judging will be at 10 a. m. and sheep at 1 p. m. At 2 p. m. entrants in the swine division will be judged and at 3 p. m. the judging of beef cattle will take place.

New Fertilizer Plant Opens At Comanche

One of the largest new industries of this section, The Central Texas Fertilizer Company, opened this week in Comanche. It was built at a cost of approximately \$100,000.00.

All machinery is completely new and of the most modern type, capable of producing 80 tons of fertilizer per hour. It is operated and serviced by expert and experienced mechanics.

Company officials explain that their product will be put on the market under an iron-clad guarantee for correct analysis and good physical conditions, which means that any and all of its fertilizer which might tend to cake or harden may be returned to the company or dealers without question.

The Central Texas Fertilizer Company will put its product on the market under the trade name of "Topper Brand" with each bag carrying the picture of a large top hat. The company is now in production at maximum capacity and it is hoped that the location of this new industry will tend to relieve the critical fertilizer needs in this highly diversified area.

A formal opening for Comanche's newest enterprise is being planned for March or April.

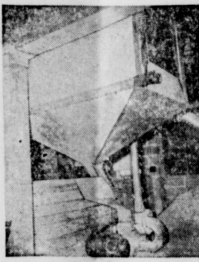

Farm Topics

Homemade Weighing Bin Speeds Work Device Aids Automatic Feed Handling Setup

It is an old saying that all farm equipment was first thought of by a farmer. Whether that saying holds true may be questioned. But it is certain that much of it did come into being as the result of ideas which some farmer had concerning ways to improve and speed up the performance of his various chores.

A pertinent example of this fact is shown in the accompanying illustration. It shows a homemade weighing bin, which was conceived by a Midwestern farmer for use with his automatic feed handling setup. It holds several tons of feed and is fixed to the ceiling by a series of heavy springs and turnbuckles, one spring being located at each corner of the bin in the center of two turnbuckles. Tension on the springs moves a pointer across a scale at the bottom of the bin to indicate weight up to 3,200 pounds. A slide gate at the bottom of the bin permits feed to spill out into a cart in desired quantities. The bin

is placed below a chute leading from a two-ton mixer in the barn room. The entire setup operates as follows: Whole grain is blown into an overhead bin, from which it flows into a blower-equipped hammermill on the first floor. Ground grain is blown back into the mixer and then drops into the weighing bin. The mixer and grinder are operated by five-horsepower motors, whereas the whole grain is blown into the storage bin by tractor power.

AROUND THE HOUSE

When using excelsior for packing china or glassware, dampen the excelsior and as it dries it will shape itself to the article, thereby forming a protective framework.

Before you clean or examine an electrical appliance, be sure to disconnect it from the electric outlet.

When making pie crust, place the shell in the refrigerator for about 30 minutes before baking. Chilling increases flakiness.

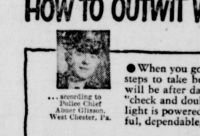

Automatic Egg Washer



Prof. F. B. Wright demonstrating the new egg washing machine developed at Cornell university. The device makes it possible for two persons to wash, dry and pack five cases of eggs an hour, five times as fast as the same jobs could be done by hand. As most poultrymen and their wives spend from two to four evenings a week cleaning eggs by hand, this machine will result in a big saving in time.

Formula Computes Feed Required for One Hen

High egg production clearly takes more feed, but just as clearly the feed brings a greater return in terms of eggs than the same amount fed to low-producing hens. Dr. L. E. Card of the Illinois experiment station explains how to compute the total feed required for one hen for a year.

Multiply the live weight of the bird, in pounds, by 8. Add 25. Divide the total number of eggs the hen lays by 7 (e. g. 105 divided by 7 equals 15) and add this figure to the total obtained by the first two steps. An example: Weight of hen—5 pounds. Five times 8 equals 40; plus 25 equals 65. Hen lays 105 eggs per year. Divide this figure by 7. Result 15. Total feed required—80 pounds. (65 plus 15).

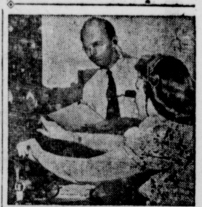

IN AIDING OTHERS HE AIDS HIMSELF

To big Ed Landwehr the job of making aids for the hard of hearing is about like a chef tasting his own broth. Ed has known the confusion of partial deafness since early childhood and now, as electrical test engineer at Western Electric Company's Clifton, N. J., Plant, he helps to manufacture the very type of hearing aid that came to his own assistance.



While still attending Northeastern University, from which he graduated with a degree in electrical engineering, Ed spent his summer vacations working as a waiter and bartender in his father's restaurant in New Britain, Conn. Because of his impaired hearing, particularly in the noisy hubbub of a busy restaurant, he found he was garbling orders. As Ed says, with a smile, "If a man asked for tomato soup and got potato salad, and later expected spaghetti and found spinach on his plate, his language grew somewhat abusive. I could hear the abbe, and so did too many others in the room." Several such experiences convinced him he needed a hearing aid, which he promptly procured.

"OK! That's got it." Ed Landwehr, Electrical Test Engineer at the Western Electric Plant in Clifton, New Jersey, himself a wearer of a Hearing Aid, tests a Hearing Aid on a Receiver Efficiency Test Set operated by Dorothy Vanderwalk.

at Western Electric and eventually was placed in the Clifton plant. Although much of his effort was spent on engineering certain testing equipment for electronic war weapons, part of his job is the design of equipment to test hearing aids during manufacture and before they are shipped. Knowing the handicap of impaired hearing, Ed gets a lot of pleasure out of his work, which brings better hearing to thousands like himself.

Sabbath School Lessons

SCRIPTURE: Acts 2:37-47; Ephesians 1:1-6
DEVOTIONAL READING: Ephesians 1:14, 11-13

Christian Fellowship
Lesson for February 22, 1948

GEORGE WASHINGTON was a splendid example of Christian fellowship. If you will travel through the older portion of the United States, particularly in Virginia, you will come upon numerous instances of church pews marked as follows, "George Washington worshipped in this pew on blank date." Evidently, it was his custom to attend public worship in whatever church community he spent the Lord's day.

Thus he entered into Christian fellowship, gaining a blessing and rendering a blessing.

The lesson passage for Sunday is found in Acts 2:37-47 and Ephesians 4:1-6, with several other passages which will be quoted before we finish the column for this week.

A HAPPY TIME IN CHURCH

READ Acts 2:41-47, and you will find a picture of a group of very happy people. Think of its three thousand people professing faith in Jesus and receiving baptism in one day! But read on—they were not only happy at church, but they were happy because they were in the church. They continued steadfastly in the apostles' teachings and fellowship and breaking of bread and prayer.

They praised God and had favor with all the people. By their daily living they were convincing the world that fellowship in Christ is not only good on Sunday while we are at the meeting house, but good every day.

The happy homes are the homes where Christian fellowship abounds, and it is equally true in every area of life.

BELONGING TO THE CHURCH

THE passage in Acts 2:37-47 tells us how certain people, after hearing the great sermon by Peter, asked how they might be saved. He told them: "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

When we invite intermediate friends to attend Sunday school and worship services with us, and they come to know of the love of God, they, too, will want to be saved. It is then the high privilege of Christian boys and girls to lead their friends to accept Jesus Christ as savior, and come into the church.

In Ephesians 4:4-6, we read these words: "There is one body and one spirit, just as you were called to the one hope, that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all, who is above all and through all and in all."

ALL ONE IN CHRIST

THE above passage from Ephesians teaches clearly that there is a brotherhood of man, real and abiding, when we accept the Fatherhood of God, through Jesus Christ. This is the meaning of the church. No amount of man-made creeds can save us. No amount of ritual and ceremony can save us. We are saved by grace through faith, and that is the gift of God. When we repent of our sins and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, we are saved, and not until then.

The one adequate solvent for the crying needs of this frightened world is the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ. Just as thousands were saved on Pentecost and again on the Lord's Day when Peter preached in Solomon's porch, so today many may be saved where the Gospel is proclaimed in its simplicity and power.

We are one in Christ, of every race and every tongue. The fellowship of Christian faith transcends every barrier—racial, economic, geographic, political, religious. We are to proclaim the universality of this good news—proclaim it in our words and proclaim it in our daily lives. The world waits wistfully for the encompassing fellowship that is in Christ and in Christ alone.

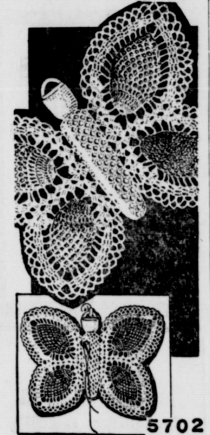
