More than seventy-five workmen started work Wednesday morning on the Lone Star Gas Company's distribution system in the downtown district while draymen were unloading pipe in residential streets east and north of Breadway.

H. F. Tickle is in charge of the construction gang.

Many laborers signed up for this company by the Chamber of Commerce were put to work and were working on the first ditches which are being dug in alleys of the downtown section. At noon more than three blocks of ditches had been dug and welders were putting the pipe together preparatory to painting and placing

in the ditch. The ditching machine was also put to work and by the end of the week several blocks of ditches will be completed and many thousands of feet of pipe will be welded together.
