Charlie Chappel Redwine was born at Watervalley, Miss. April 7, 1880, and died January 29, 1948, being 67 years, 9 months and 22 days of age at the time of his death.

He was married to Eva Redwine November 5, 1900. To this union five boys and two girls were born, two boys and one girl preceding him in death. Mrs. Eva Redwine passed away November 9, 1919.

He was married to Mamie Lee Delaney December 22, 1920. To this union one son was born.

Hog Mange Causes Average Loss of \$2

New Insecticide Proves Effective in Control

Common mange of hogs is another widespread disease that has yielded to the results of animal health research. The U. S. department of agriculture says the average losses from mange probably amount to \$2 a head. This figure covers the loss from stunted growth, delay in fattening, occasional deaths and dockage when manny hogs are marketed.

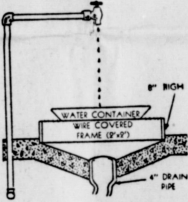
The effective weapon against mange is benzene hexachloride, frequently referred to as "666." In Nebraska tests this newly-discovered insecticide was so effective it eradicated mange with one treatment. Not only does it eradicate mange — it also got rid of lice. This makes the old mange treatments obsolete.

In the Nebraska tests, crude benzene hexachloride (a wettable powder) was mixed with water (10 pounds powder in 100 gallons) and sprayed on the hogs.

One objectionable feature of the crude benzene hexachloride is its terrific odor. This odor is not present to any marked degree in commercial hogs oils prepared by use of a solvent which takes the active ingredient (the gamma isomer) out of the crude benzene hexachloride and leaves behind the ineffective ingredients — the ones that have the disagreeable odor.

Herds and Flocks

Pond water piped to farm buildings for livestock can be filtered by building a solid housing of soft brick (laid in cement) over the end of the pipe in the bottom of the pond.



Water filters through the pores of the brick.

First treatment for cattle grub should be made early in winter, as soon as the tell-tale bumps appear on the backs of animals. Several treatments a month apart will be necessary. Use a cattle grub dust containing 1 1/2 per cent rotenone.

The current shortage of feed makes it important to do continuous culling in the laying house.

Dairy cows lose a lot of energy pulling through heavy mud in the barn lots. Lost energy means less milk. Paved lots that take cows out of the mud soon pay for themselves.

Mow and Spray in One Operation Pays Well

AROUND THE HOUSE

If the seat of a cane chair has worn through, and the chair does not warrant a new cane seat, buy a leatherette one at the dime store and tack it over the vacancy.

When fitting a garment for sloping shoulders, deepen the seams in line with the tip of the shoulder.

Use a pretty floral oilcloth runner on your teenager's dresser. This offers protection to wood underneath from such spilled liquids as perfumes and hand lotions.

Men find that their coat pockets aren't quite deep enough to carry their thermos bottle in. Sew a strip of one-half inch black elastic above the pocket just high enough that it may be slipped over the unprotected part of the thermos bottle.

To mend cracks in china dishes, boil milk in a stain-resistant enamel. Place damaged dishes gently in the milk. Allow to remain a few minutes and the crack should be mended.

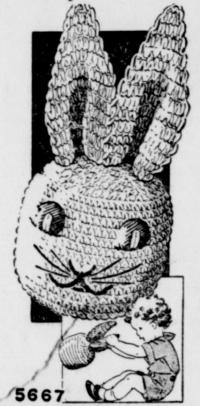

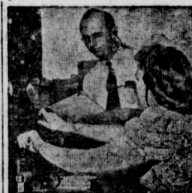

IN AIDING OTHERS
HE AIDS HIMSELF

To big Ed Landwehr the job of making aids for the hard of hearing is about like a chef tasting his own broth. Ed has known the confusion of partial deafness since early childhood and now, as electrical test engineer at Western Electric Company's Clifton, N. J., Plant, he helps to manufacture the very type of hearing aid that came to his own assistance.

While still attending Northeastern University, from which he graduated with a degree in electrical engineering, Ed spent his summer vacations working as a waiter and bartender in his father's restaurant in New Britain, Conn. Because of his impaired hearing, particularly in the noisy hubbub of a busy restaurant, he found he was garbling orders. As Ed says, with a smile, "If a man asked for tomato soup and got potato salad, and later expected spaghetti and found spinach on his plate, his language grew somewhat abusive. I could hear the abuse, and so did too many others in the room." Several such experiences convinced him he needed a hearing aid, which he promptly procured.

Not long out of college, Ed applied for an engineering position

at Western Electric and eventually was placed in the Clifton plant. Although much of his effort was spent on engineering certain testing equipment for electronic war weapons, part of his job is the design of equipment to test hearing aids during manufacture and before they are shipped. Knowing the handicap of impaired hearing, Ed gets a lot of pleasure out of his work, which brings better hearing to thousands like himself.

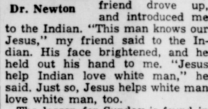

The Nature of Jesus

Lesson for February 8, 1948

ONE of the most discerning comments on the nature of Jesus we have ever heard came from an aged Indian in one of the western states a few years ago...



Dr. Newton said he was sitting on a large rock... I tried to speak with him, but he did not seem to understand what I said...

TEACHER and LORD TAKE the opening passage, John 13:1-17, where Jesus is pictured as taking a basin of water and towel, kneeling at the disciples' feet...

It requires true love, true humility, to serve in that role. Suppose someone came to render his services to you? And suppose that One was the Son of God?

"Why did Jesus wash the disciples' feet? Because he loved them, and he wanted them to love other people enough to do for them anything that would convince them of the love which they had in their hearts for him. Here we see him as the great teacher."

Peter acted very naturally, even if he may be tempted to say that he acted foolishly. In fact, he acted just about like any of us would have acted under similar circumstances.

But when Jesus explained to Peter what he was about, Peter then asked that Jesus wash not only his feet, but also his hands and head.

INTERMEDIATES, young people—and adults, having carefully read the passage in the 13th chapter of John, where Jesus washes the disciples' feet, will now turn to John 6:35-40, and Colossians 1:9-20, and see the expansion of this great truth over into the expressed will of God for his followers.

A true understanding of this section will lead us to ponder prayerfully the nature of Jesus in the various titles accorded him in the Scriptures — Son of Man, Son of God, Master, Rabbi, Teacher, Physician, Vine, Light, Good Shepherd, Bread of Life, Comforter, Friend and Saviour.

All of these titles he bore, and yet we see him kneeling to wash the feet of everyday people. "Thy gentleness hath made me great. Intermediates and young people will wisely set themselves to the task of identifying the nature of Jesus in the people of their community. Such study will lead you to earnestly seek to walk in his blessed example, loving as he loved."

"WE THINK YE OF CHRIST?" AND now we are ready for the climax of the lesson, when Peter declares, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God."

We cannot long stand in the presence of the story of this lesson and fail to conclude with Peter that none save the Son of God can do such wondrous things — can love as the Incarnation, we follow through the sweeping claims of Jesus, and we know of a truth that he was very God. Convinced, then, that we are in the presence of God when we contemplate the nature of Jesus, what are we to say? Does not Isaac Watts suggest the answer?

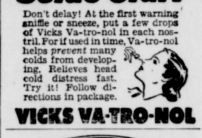

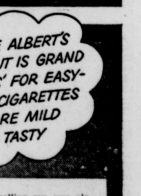
