Hog Mange Causes Average Loss of \$2

CITCUIVE IN CONTON Common mange of hogs is another widespread disease that has yielded to the results of animal health re-search. The U. S. department of griculture says the average losses from mange probably amount to \$2 a head. This figure covers the tons-tening, occasional deaths and dock-age when mangy hogs are mar-keted.
