The Garden Spot

It now looks as if our county peanut crop will be one of the best ever. We do not yet know if the peanut crop in the county will be as large as the 1966 crop, but several farmers hame told me their indiwas in 1966. The average peanut yield in 1966 was 41.9 bushels per acre in Eastland County-the best yield on re-

Many believe that this year's crop will be valued higher than the 1966 crop because the price of peanuts are up \$13.25 per ton over the '66

crop.
The County ASOS records show that the average yields in the county were from 17 to 20 bushels per acre, between 1960 and 1964. In 1965 the yield was 23.2 bushels and in 1967 it was 31.2.

Increased use of irrigation and better production practices are largely responsible for the increase in yields the last four years. However, the

1968 Pecan Show To Be Dedicated To J. M. Cooper

The 1968 Eastland County Pecan Show will be dedicated to the late J. M. Cooper. The officers and directors of the Eastland Pecan Growers Association and the special event committee of the Eastland Chamber of Commerce made the decision in a joint meeting Nov. 4.

Grover Hallmark, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce committee, said this would be the 16th annual Eastland County Pecan Show and the first time for the show to be held in Eastland. He said it would be an appropriate occasion to honor Copper, the former county agent, who organized the first pecan show in the state.

Disability Work Credits Are Reduced

Persons becoming disabled before age 31 will now need fewer work credits to get disability benefits than they did prior to the 1967 amendments, according to a report from the Social Security office in Abilene.

The report stated that if a person is disabled between the ages of 24 and 31, he needs credits for one half the time between age 21 and the time he becomes unable to work. If one is disabled before he reaches age 24, he needs only one and a half years of work credits out of the direc-year period ending when the disa-

bility began.


