Several distinctions are claimed for the unique commuter service offered by a helicopter, which operates between Boston's Logan airport and the roof of a downtown

port and the roof or a worming garage.

The flying eggleater, as the plane is known, is the only helicopter in scheduled passenger service in the world; is the only one landing regularly on a roof of a building; it flies on the shortest airline route in the world; it charges the highest rate per mile, and it flies at the slowest speed of any scheduled passenger clane.

plane. The distance is about two miles as the crow flies and its mechanical cousin, the helicopter, flies. Considering that the fare is \$3.50, tax included, passengers are paying at the rate of \$1.75 per mile. 
