### New Device Doubles Power of **Engine and Eliminates Valves**

WASHINGTON. — The commerce department displayed a device which its German inventor said was capable of doubling the power output of the conventional automobile

put of the conventional autormounengine.

A department report credited the
invention to Dr. Adolph Schnuerle
and described it as a "loop scavenging" system of blowing out exhaust
gases from combustion engines.
Schnuerle told a department investigator, the report said, that it eliminates need of engine valves.

Dr. Schnuerie claims, the report continued, that tests had shown a two-stroke, two-cycle engine with loop scavenging could produce twice as much power per cylinder as a conventional four-cycle engine.

The loop-scavenging system has ports in the cylinder walls arranged in such positions and at such angles that the blast of scavenging air makes a loop inside the cylinder, cleaning out the burned gases.

The device probably will be turned over to American engineers for further research.

NEW YORK.— Rubber manufacturers, employing 300,000 workers, preduced a thumping 2.3 billion doise the peak of the prewar total of 1940.

In a relatively strike-free year, marred by only one five-week shutdown (General Tire & Rubber comsponded with 88 million tires—68 for automobiles and 22 for trucks and other vehicles.

'In 1947 we'll produce 80 million more and get the whole country back on wheels—62 million for pashicles," Herbert E. Smith, president of the United States Rubber company, predicted.



### Toy Banks That Performed When Deposit Was Made

Between the years 1865 and 1900, between the years 1805 and 1900, the toymakers of America produced some 200 types of mechanical toy banks, atop which figures would perform when a coin was inserted and a lever pressed, says Collier's. The more ingenious ones were those whose figures themselves deposited the coins.
