## COUNTY PECAN GROWERS WIN HONORS AT BROWNWOOD SHOW

Eastland County pecan growers won a fair share of honors at the Brown County Pecan Show held at Brownwood last Friday and Saturday by capturing sixteen ribbons and the reserve champion plaque, according to word from County Agent J. M. Cooper's office.

A total of seven of the sixteen were first place honors, it was said.

C. E. Smith, Rising Star grower, got a first place with his Success variety, a first place with his Halbert, a second with Delmas and a third place in the unnamed seedling division.

B. B. Freeman, Rt. 1, Ranger, took a first place with his Comanche entry. This went on into the finals and took the reserve championship of the show. This is a fairly new variety, developed by the research folks and is a cross between Success and Burkett. It looks a lot like a Burkett, according to Cooper.

Freeman got a second with his Williamson, second with his San Saba, a third with his Stuart and

Western Schley and a first with his Wichita, also a new variety of pecans.

Lee Lieske, Rt. 2, Cisco, whose orchard is in the Nimrod Community, took a first with his John Garner and a second with his Texas Prolific.

Doss Alexander, also of Rising Star, took first with his Eastern Schley and Texas Prolific, third with his Kincaid and second place with his unnamed seedling.

## Marketing Quota Vote On Peanuts Set For Dec. 15

COLLEGE STATION — A national marketing quota referendum for peanut growers, the first in three years, will be held on December 15, according to Searcy Ferguson, chairman, Texas Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee. The balloting will determine whether or not marketing quotas will be in effect for the next three crops of peanuts.

If at least two-thirds of the votes are favorable, quotas will be in effect for the 1960, '61 and '62 crops of peanuts. Penalties will apply to "excess" peanuts, and price supports will be available to growers who comply with their acreage allotments at the full level of support announced, said Ferguson.

If more than one-third of the voters oppose, quotas and penalties will not be in effect for the 1960 peanut crop, and the level of price support to eligible growers will drop to 50 percent of parity. In such a case, another referendum would be held in 1960 for the following three crops. A grower will be eligible to vote in the December 15 referendum, Ferguson said, if he is entitled to share in 1959-crop peanuts planted for harvest as nuts on a farm having more than one acre of peanuts planted.

Peanut marketing quotas have been in effect each year since 1949. In the last referendum, quotas for the 1957, '58 and '59 crops were favored by 93.5 percent of the growers voting.

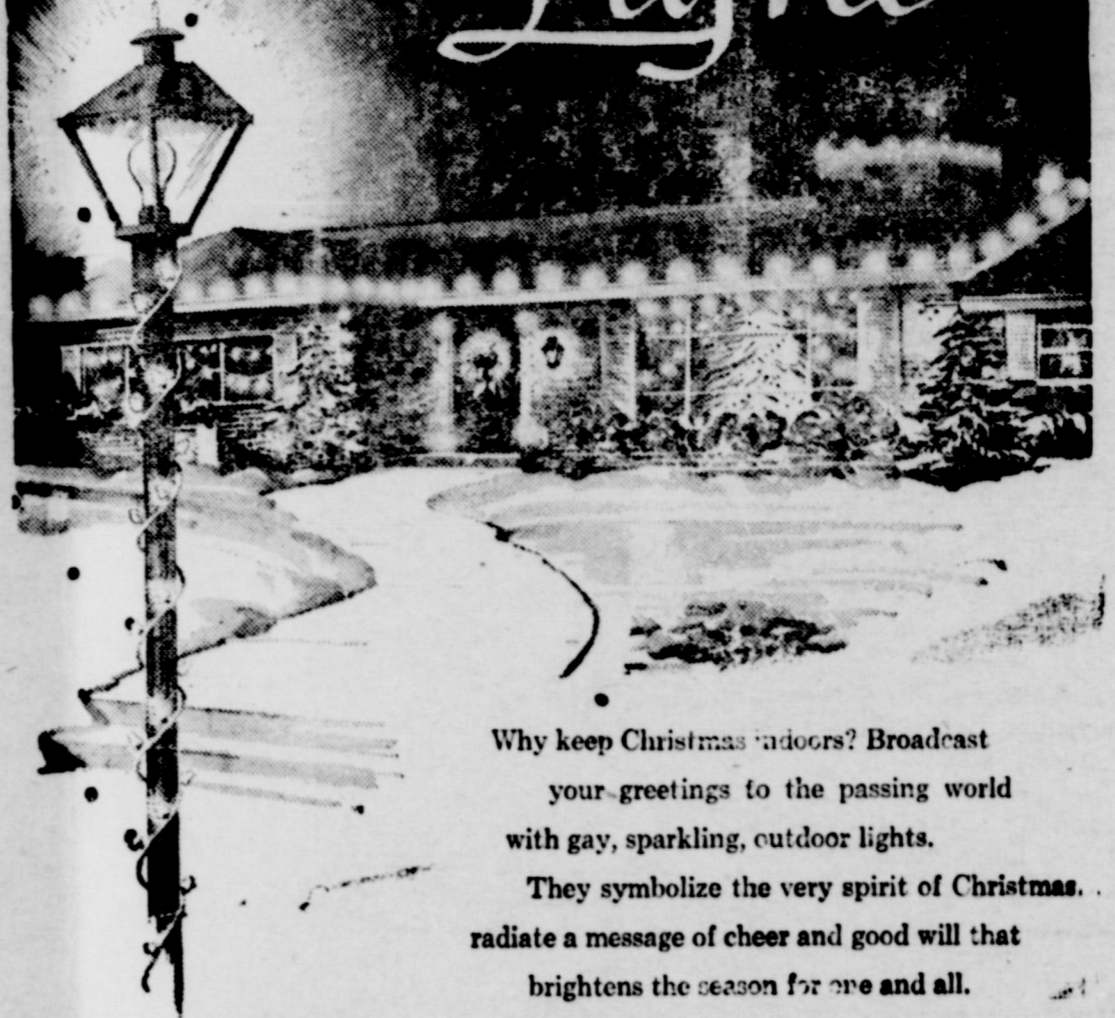

Freezing Lemon Pies . . . Make the crust as you would any pie whether you plan to freeze it or eat it the day it is baked. Cool the crust before placing the filling in it. Prepare the filling and pour into the cool crust. If you are making lemon meringue be sure to cook the filling as long as the directions indicate. When the filling is thick enough it will hold its shape. The meringue will be placed on the pie later, at serving time. Wrap each pie separately for the freezer. Cover with a paper plate and keep it in place with a sticky tape. Place in foil or moisture-vapor proof or in a pliofilm bag; fasten securely. Each pie is protected and can be stacked in the freezer . . . Store at 0 degrees F. For the meringue . . . you can also freeze the egg whites for the pie. Three egg whites frozen together make the right amount for one meringue pie. Thaw the whites for the meringue, taking from freezer about 1 hour before use. Bring to room temperature for beating. Be sure to beat egg whites thoroughly for a high, light meringue that will hold up. Spread meringue on the frozen pie, and bake in a 350 degree oven for about 15 to 20 minutes, or until browned evenly. For cheese and chiffon lemon pies, there's no use to heat. Simply remove from

freezer and thaw.

### Only 1959 Pecans May Be Entered In County Show

Nuts entered in the Seventh Annual Eastland County Pecan Show to be held at Cisco on December 11th-12th must have been grown in 1959 by the person exhibiting them, according to R. L. Ponsler, president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, who jointly with the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association is sponsoring the two day affair.

People who live in towns with only one tree are equally welcome to enter a quart of their pecans, the same as those with large orchards or groves, according to Oscar Schaefer, Cook Community, president of the growers association.

Over 70 different growers entered Burkett pecans in the 1958 show. Growers not only from Eastland but from adjoining counties as well are eligible and

encouraged to show their nuts. The show is held in the county annually for the purpose of focusing attention on the pecan industry, to recognize the tremendous potential possibilities of growing pecans in the area and to learn and to compare varieties. The per capita consumption of pecans in the United States is a little less than on pound, it was explained.

About 20 different papershell varieties and dozens of different natives or seedlings will be seen in the show. Burkett, Mahans and Western Schley usually have more entries in the show than do other thin shell varieties.

The bake show featuring pecan cakes, pies, cookies and candy under the supervision of the County Home Demonstration Council will be a featured part of the show.

A pecan queen contest will also be held in conjunction with the affair. Mrs. Peggy Gallagher, Cisco, is in charge of the contest.
