### DETAILS OF MONROE'S DEATH REACH ANGELO.

San Angelo, Tex., May 22.—More of the details of the death of John Monroe the Sheffield stockman who was killed Tuesday evening in Fort Worth reached the city Thursday.

He was superintending the unloading of a car of sheep at the stock yards when he slipped and fell from the top of a freight car. He died an hour later from internal injuries, the result of being crushed between two cars.

Mr. Monroe was well known in Angelo and generally throughout West Texas. His wife came in from Fort Stockton Wednesday evening.

Mr. Monroe's remains arrived from Fort Worth Thursday afternoon at 2:15 o'clock and are being prepared for burial by the Charles A. Robinson Undertaking Company. Interment will take place at Fairmont cemetery at 4:30 o'clock. Rev. Weeks will conduct the funeral services.

### FOURTH CLASS POST- MASTER EXAMINATION

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that on the date named above an examination will be held at Ballinger, Texas, as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth class postmaster of class (A) at Rowena, and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill the vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$615.00 for the last fiscal year.

Age limit, 21 years and over on the date of the examination with the exception that in a State women are declared by statute to be of full age for all purposes at 18 years, women 18 years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted.

Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which the examination is announced.

The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements.

Application forms and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at Rowena and the local secretary at Ballinger or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.

Applications should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington at least 7 days before the date of the examination otherwise it may be impracticable to examine the applicants.

U. S. S. Albany, April 21-13.  
I am in Han Haw, China, and have been having a pretty good time here. We just arrived here from Shang Hai. I think we will go back there pretty soon, and I will be glad of it, as that is a good place for a sailor to have a good time. We go out on a church party ever Sunday. It is pretty nice in the Captain to let us go ashore and grant us that much time. We go to the Y. M. C. A. and from there we get the Y. M. C. A. man and go out to some private American house and sing and play music, and have a pretty good time. How is old Ballinger and the people getting along? What has Jack McKay and Jim Flynt been doing for cigar money and chewing tobacco since me and "Tuffy" left? "Tuffy" and I got parted after all. He is on the Cincinnati, and is in Mani. P. I. I received a letter from him, and he says he does not like it much, but he is stuck and can't get out.

I have had only one fight since I left Ballinger, and I never even got scratched. I am a mess cook, and an old boy who was helping me shine knives got gay, and I had him knocked on the deck before he knew it. He tried to put me on report for it, but they would not believe him. Well, I have got to go to work, and will close. Tell all my folks and friends hello for me and tell some of the boys to write to me. I wish you would send me some Ballinger papers.

### SHIPPING RECORDS

Railroad and Express Records  
Make Interesting Showing.  
What Prohibition Has  
Done for Ballinger.

Mr. Voter, when an anti tells you that prohibition does not prohibit, and calls your attention to the great (?) amount of whiskey that is being shipped to Ballinger just hand him these figures, which were compiled this week, and which are correct, and tell him to go off and post himself before trying to mislead the intelligent voters of this county.

The records of the two railroads leading into Ballinger and the rec-

ords of the Express Co., show approximately the following amounts of intoxicants received in Ballinger during the last two years with saloons:

Beer, 91 cars—13,650 kegs.  
Whiskey, 2300 barrels—119,600 gallons.

During the last two years with out saloons the same records show that the following amount of intoxicants have been received:

Beer, no cars. By express 2016 kegs.

Whiskey, no barrels—6,834 gallons.

11,634 kegs of beer less with prohibition than with saloons.

112,766 gallons less whiskey received with prohibition than with saloons. And yet our anti friends says its a bad thing for a town to be without saloons.

When we figure the enormous amount of beer down to gallons and see that with saloons in Bal-

lenger that during two years over 109,200 gallons of beer were consumed through the saloons, and the figures shown to the glass and figure the price at 5 cents per glass one can get, a faint idea of the great difference in dollars and cents that are saved by the removing of saloons from our community.

We again challenge the saloon advocates to come out in the open and show one reason why saloons should be allowed to open in Ballinger. They can't do it, nor can they offer any argument in favor of the saloon. Ballinger is one of the most moral towns in Texas, as is shown by our court records, grand jury reports, etc. Are you as a citizen, a father of boys and girls, doing your part towards making it a better town. We are on the verge of prosperous times again, and one or two good crops would make our people the most happy and contented people in Texas. We are proud of our school, our happy homes, and we appeal to every man in this county who stands for those things that makes for the better homes, the citizens, to join us in placing a strong approval on the principles of prohibition and take a stand against the open saloon that makes for the home wreck and ruin.

During the last two years with saloons in Ballinger two men were murdered while drunk. We have not had anything of the kind under prohibition. If you vote for saloons to come back to Ballinger and they are the cause of murder, you will be a party to the crime.
