Federal Judge Reverses Oklahoma Case in Which Bank Was Fined for Alleged Violation of the Webb Law.

St. Paul, Minn. June 13.—A oank which collects a sight draft representing the purchase price of liquor shipped by interstate commerce into a prohibition state does not violate the law prohibiting a carrier from acting as agent according to an opinion today by United States circuit court of ap-


