Storm Walning Unit Installed

In Kanger Area

Bureau, located at Amon Cart Field in Fort Worth, has installed a pressure indicator control unit in Ranger for the purpose of keeping the U. S. Weather Bureau posted on four weather conditions in this area, it has been reported here.

Similar units are being installed in areas throughout this part of the state which are out of the radar scope radius of the Bureau, to enable the Bureau to make controlete and accurate coverage of all areas.

The unit works on the basis of recording a drastic change in barometric pressure. If there is a sudden drop in barometric pres-sure, the unit gives off a signal, at which time the Ranger Police Department will call the Weather Bureau and notify them of the signal. With these signals coming in from all over the country, the Weather Bureau will be able to localize any tornado or storm

A signal from the unit doe; no necessarily mean that there toriado or storm brewing, bu ditions are of the type where tornadoes and severe storms breed.

ALUMINUM — Never leave food in an aluminum pan any longer than necessary. Wash with a mild soap and water or a mild detergent soon after using them. Leaving food in them causes the formation of pits or holes, thus making them harder to clean. Use steel wool to scour or a mild abrasive such as whit-

ing. Rinse vell with hot water and dry carefully. Never use soda, lye, stong soaps or other strong alkali in aluminum pans. If an alumnum pan becomes slightly displored, boil it in something tat is acid, such as vinegar and water or cream of tarter.

you would for glass. Usually this can be cleaned simply by washing wit mild soap and water. Soak is water before cleaning if someting has been burned in it. Do no scrape it.

easily cleand. Take off food that sticks with a gritless clean-

ing powder such as whiting or extremely fine steel wool. Otherwise keep it clean with the usual washing with hot suds of mild soap, rinsing and careful drying. IRON — is an old stand-by.

Scour iron with steel wool and use a strong alkaline soap to remove grease. If food sticks on iron, soak the utensil in a hot water soda solution using 3 Tablespoons of soda to one quart of water. Bring this to a boil. Scrub with a stiff brush and scouring powder. Wash with hot soapy water, rinse and dry. Always keep iron thoroughly dry. Just a little moisture will

remove the rust with scouring powder and steel wool.

SILVER — Remove any tarnish immediately. The best way to keep silver free from tarnish is to use it. Wash it regularly in a mild soap suds, rinse well and dry thoroughly. You should avoid soaking hollow handled silver pieces in hot water. cement holding the handles may loosen. There are a number of methods and preparations which may be used satisfactorily for polishing silver.

Q - I'm confused about the rm "Korea veteran." What are the official time limits that dethe official time limits that determine whether or not a former member of the armed forces is considered to be a veteran of the Korean Conflict?

A — The Korean Conflict, by official definition, extends from June 27, 1950, to January 31,

1955. Any veteran with all or part of his service between these two dates is considered a Korea

Q - As a veteran with a serv-ice-connected disability rated 50percent I have been receiving extra compensation for a dependent daughter. Recently she passed age 18. Was supposed to report this to VA?

A — Yes. As soon as your daughter reached age 18 she was no longer legally a dependent. VA is not permitted to pay you extra compensation for her, and money received for her after age 18 must be returned.
