I was laid upon the Cross, which was then pulled over a cross fixed to two vertical poles by means of ropes. So, swinging, and without a hand to steady it. the cross was reared to a vertical position, to fall with a thud (which shook every bone in my body) into a socket prepared for it. Afterwards the two malesfactors were fixed to the crosses formed by the horizontal bar and the posts, the bar was cut in two and they were turned so that fac

"I shall never forget the scene: practically all Jersalem came out to the hill of Calvary, and the cries and screaming of the people still ring in my ears.






