Washington, July 23.—Representative Smith of Texas today presented the war department a request from an El Paso newspaper that a band of armed Americans be permitted to cross the border to the relief of Americans said to have been endangered at Madera, Mexico. Mr. Smith was told that such an act would be a violation of neutrality laws, a virtual act of war, and that United States troops would prevent it.

POLITICAL FORECAST.

Rumors have frequently reached the Bulletin office from one source and another, that Gov. Colquitt will be a candidate for some kind of office at the next general election. Some said that he would undoubtedly be a candidate for the third term as governor. Others said that he would be a candidate for congressman-at-large, an now Hugh Nugent Fitzgerald, of the Fort Worth Record, announces that Gov. Colquitt will be a candidate for United States Senator, to succeed Charles A. Culberson. The Fort Worth editor, who is skilled in reading the political signs and forecasting them, says this is authoritative, that Culberson's health is precarious and that his resignation may be expected any time.—Brownwood Bulletin.

ARE WE ON THE TEXAS TO FRISCO ROUTE?

The building of the auto highway from Texarkana across Texas to El Paso is attracting more attention now than the building of any railroad that was ever undertaken in Texas. At each of the above places this highway will connect with the New York to Frisco highway that is being built and will afford an auto route across the continent. It is a big undertaking, but it is going to be built, Balinger is fortunate in having an opportunity to get on this line. Angelo has been selected for the meeting of the promoters of this public highway and the meeting will be held at an early date, and promises to be one of the most enthusiastic good roads conventions ever held in Texas.

"Over half of the cities and counties along the proposed route have enthusiastically taken up the movement. Fort Worth, Dallas, Greenville, Texarkana, El Paso, and other cities along the line will send large delegations.

"The proposed route, which will lead through the center of the state, and which will be one of the longest within its borders, will pass through the following cities: Texarkana, Greenville, Dallas, Ft. Worth, Mineral Wells, San Angelo, Mertzon, Ft. Stockton, Alpine, Marfa, Sierra Blanca and El

Paso. "That the movement is rapidly finding favor is being shown by the operations which are already being undertaken in many counties. The Dallas and Fort Worth Motor clubs have joined in the movement, while the chambers of commerce in the various cities along the line have pledged their hearty support.
