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SCHOOL CHILDREN TAUGHT THE ORIGIN OF MAN.

There was a bomb exploded in the camp at Elgin Sunday night when Evangelist Ham, who is conducting a union meeting for the community, came on the platform about 8 o'clock and spoke to Mr. Ramsay, the chorister, who immediately silenced the large choir. And Evangelist Ham opened a strange-looking book, which he announced was one of the new text books for Texas schools—Physical Geography by R. S. Tarr—and read the following lines—“Page 366, Paragraph 243. Early Man—The origin of man is not known, although scientists generally agree that he has developed by the process of evolution from some high form of animal. This belief is based upon the close resemblance between the body of man and ape, and receives support from the fact that, in habits and mode of living, some savages are little above animals. But even the least civilized men have powers that no animal possesses, while civilized man is so far above the highest animals that some people believe it impossible that he is the descendant of an animal.” Then he read from Genesis 1-27, “And God created man in His own image, in the image of God created He him; male and female created He them.” Now you mothers and fathers can understand why your children have so little respect for you and so little faith in God and the Bible. How can a child respect his ancestors when he has been taught that they are descendants of monkeys? How can he believe in God and the Bible when his school has taught him that it is absolutely false, fallacy and fiction? The statement, “Scientists generally agree,” I challenge and brand as not only unworthy of a scholar, but a barefaced lie which will be repudiated by the rank and file of reputable scientists the world over. The evangelist then read the opinions of quite a number of noted

scientists to uphold his position. Then he said: “I challenge any professor in any State University to produce one scientific fact in support of the Darwinian theory of the origin of man. I also say that a man who has not enough sense to distinguish between science and philosophy is disqualified as a scholar to be the author of a text book for our schools, and I further say that a board of education who will pass on such a book and hand it over to our school children is eternally disqualified for that office. They might be skillful enough to pick and grade cotton, but certainly they are unfit to select and grade school books for the school. And an administration which will appoint such a board need never pose any more as an educative administration, for they have made themselves the ridicule of scholars and, last but not least, they have insulted the Christian conscience of the State to pass such blasphemous rot over to the truthful youths of our State.

“I will advise the clean-up committee at Austin to turn their attention from the cesspools into which they are looking, toward the source of the stream and inspect the poison that is being poured in there.”

Following the evangelist's remarks Prof. Mallard, superintendent of the schools in Elgin, arose and said “that book would not be taught in the public schools here this year.”—Elgin Courier.

Certainly this is going to meet with objection on the part of school trustees, teachers and patrons, and well it should. This book should not teach any such Darwinian theory, and as we see it is a disgrace to our schools. However, no teacher has the authority to discard it, or undertake to replace it with some other book. If

FREIGHT WRECK DELAYS TRAIN

Five Cars Plunge Through Trestle Over Butternut Creek. Conductor and Breakman Slightly Hurt.

A Santa Fe freight train running extra from Brownwood to San Angelo, was wrecked at nine-thirty Saturday morning two miles West of Benoit, when the trestle over Butternut creek gave way, plunging five cars into the water and mud.

The train was made up of twelve cars and the caboose. Most of the cars were loaded with general merchandise, and the fireman stated that they were making about twenty-five miles an hour when they crossed the trestle. The engine and eight cars had passed over the trestle before the bridge went down, and to this is due the fact that no one was killed and the wreck was not a heavier loss to the Santa Fe.

The trestle over Butternut is not a long one, perhaps sixty feet, but the heavy timbers were scattered and splintered into smithereens when the heavy loaded cars left the rails and the bridge support was knocked out. An empty flat car was left spanning the creek and next to this was the caboose, which was thrown on end in the creek. At the other end of the flat car is a freight car standing on its end. This car is loaded with a general "Dukes Mixtures" of freight. A car of cheese and one of rice and candy were thrown to one side and badly damaged, and one end of the cheese car is sticking several feet deep in the mud.

Trucks, wheels, steel and cross ties are scattered and piled along the right of way, and it will be several hours before through trains will be running. The brakeman and conductor were in the cab, on top of the caboose when they went in the ditch and were thrown to the floor, but escaped with slight bruises.

When the wreck occurred the freight train was running on a schedule that only allowed seven minutes for it to reach Ballinger and let the morning passenger, which is due at Ballinger at nine-thirty, pass. As soon as the engineer learned that the conductor and brakeman were not seriously hurt he cut his engine loose and came to Ballinger to report the wreck and hold the passenger train. The passenger train remained here until about one o'clock when it went to the wreck and the passengers and express, and mail were transferred from the train coming from Temple, and which is due here at 12:55. The transfer will be made again for the East bound train this afternoon, and will delay the train for a short while.

New York, Oct. 4.—Many friends gathered at the dock of the Lamport and Holt line today to say goodbye to Col. Roosevelt, who sailed on the steamship Vanduyck for Rio Janeiro, where he is to begin his tour of South America. Mrs. Roosevelt and Kermit Roosevelt accompanied the former President. Col. Roosevelt's trip is undertaken at the invitation of the Argentina Museo Social and of the Brazilian and Chilean universities. Arriving at Rio Janeiro Oct. 21, he will deliver a lecture in the Brazilian capital the following day on "American Internationalism." Later he will lecture in other cities of Brazil, Argentina and Chile. At the conclusion of his lecture engagement Col. Roosevelt will head a scientific expedition on behalf of the American Museum of National History into the tropical interior of the continent.

Permanent Organization Effected Saturday Morning. To Work for Good Roads in Rannels County.

Good roads enthusiasts and a number of automobile owners met in the Princess Theatre Saturday morning at ten o'clock at which time an organization which is to be known as the Rannels County Automobile and Good Roads Club was perfected.

The meeting was called to order by E. D. Walker, who stated the object of the meeting and R. P. Kirk was elected temporary chairman and A. W. Sledge temporary secretary.

After considerable discussion the membership fees were fixed at three dollars and the annual dues at two dollars, making a total cost of becoming a member of this association \$5 for the first year. After that the dues will be reduced to fifty cents. The club went into permanent organization by the electing of the following members and officers:

A. H. Van Pelt, Jo Wilmeth and E. V. Bateman were appointed as a committee to nominate a board of directors.

D. M. Baker, E. V. Bateman and C. R. Stephens were appointed committee on by-laws.

E. D. Walker was appointed chairman on membership committee, and each member was requested to solicit members.

J. W. Powell, Jo Wilmeth, E. D. Walker, R. T. Williams, and W. A. Nance were appointed to attend the good roads meeting and represent this county at the Colorado to the Gulf Highway meeting which will be held at Stamford next Tuesday.

The meeting adjourned to meet again Friday morning of next week at ten o'clock in the Princess Theatre.

The object of this organization is to promote good roads, and the meeting was enthusiastic for good roads. It is the purpose of the new organization to bring an expert engineer and road builder here and get an estimate on what it will cost to build so many miles of road in this county and to make it clear to the citizens of the county what it will cost, and where the roads will be built and show them what the benefit will be, and if possible get a bond issue passed for the work. The people are waking up on this question and are getting tired of paying taxes for patch work. They want something that will be permanent and at a much less cost in the long run. It is a waste of money to pay 15 cent tax for patching roads, when good highways can be built for practically the same cost annually if the people will issue bonds for the necessary money to do the work and let the 15 cents they are paying go towards paying the interest on the bonds and creating a sinking fund for taking them up when they mature.

As will be seen from the list of charter members a man must not be an owner of an auto to be a member of this club. It is for good roads, and every man that is in favor of good roads to the extent of being willing to contribute a small amount towards bringing about the desired end are urged to hand their name to the secretary.
