Plans For State Convention Made At Council Meet

The county Home Demonstration council meeting was held in the Texas Electric Service Company's community room in Eastland Wednesday afternoon.

The council chairman, Mrs. Virgie Hale, presided over the meeting, and Mrs. Elva Altom led the group in repeating the motto, pledge, and prayer.

It was decided to cooperate with other county councils in chartering a bus to the state meeting which will be held in Galveston in September.

Another matter of business that was transacted was the decision to sponsor a bake sale in Eastland on July 3 to raise money for council expenses.

The council voted to enter an educational booth at the West Texas Fair in Abilene in September and they discussed an exhibition booth for the Rising Star Fair.

A hat sale was conducted for the benefit of the council. Each woman present contributed a hat and, in turn, bought one — sight unseen.

Mrs. Sandra Shelton, agent, gave a civil defense report and stressed the importance of maintaining an emergency kit.

As the final matter of business for the meeting, Mrs. Bela Tucker and Mrs. Lottie Lassiter were elected delegates to the state HD convention.

NEW STATE WATER SAFETY LAW CONCERNS OWNERS OF BOATS

House Bill No. 11, which was passed by the Texas State Legislature on May 11, concerns every boat owner in the State of Texas. It will go into effect April 1, 1960.

The law, referred to as the "Water Safety Act," is a policy of the state to promote the safety of persons and property in and connected with the use, operation and equipment and to promote the uniformity of local law pertaining to them.

Parts of the act which will be foremost in the minds of boat owners include the necessary identification number required; to be obtained from the State by application not later than March 1, 1960. This will be similar to the identifying motor numbers on a car and the title shall be called a Certificate of Number.

Under the classification and equipment heading, boats are divided into four classes. Class A is less than sixteen feet in length; Class 1, sixteen feet to twenty-six feet; Class 2, over twenty-six feet and less than forty feet; and Class 3, forty feet or over.

In addition to complicated lighting requirements, every motorboat or vessel must have aboard one life preserver, buoyant vest, ring buoy or buoyant cushion of the type approved by the Commandant of the US Coast Guard in good serviceable condition for each person on board.

All motorboats of 10 horsepower or less shall be exempt

from the numbering provisions and from the safety equipment provisions except in so far as they shall be required to have one approved life preserver for each person aboard and a white light to exhibit between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

The law states that it will be unlawful to operate any motorboat or vessel or manipulate any water skis, aquaplane, or similar device in a wantonly reckless or negligent manner, so endangering the life limb or property of any person.

In case of collision, accident or other casualty involving a vessel, the operator—if the collision, accident or other casualty results in death or injury to a person or damage to property in excess of \$100—shall file with the Texas Highway Department a full and descriptive report on or before 30 days.

Every person who violates or fails to comply with any provision of the act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

The fee for the three-year registration and Certificate of Number, is as follows: Class A—\$1.00; Class 1—\$5.00; Class 2—\$10.00; Class 3—\$12.50. Such fee shall accompany the original and renewal application for certificate of number.

None of the fees of the act shall apply to commercial fishing or shrimping boats having a boat license issued by the State of Texas.

The act came out of study of the serious need for enforcement of water safety on the waters of the state. More publicity about the law will probably be furnished at a later date by the State of Texas.

Pecan Growers

Walnut caterpillars are stripping many pecan and shade trees in the area, according to a report by J. M. Cooper, Eastland County Agricultural Agent.

The caterpillar will defoliate a tree and leave it in such condition that it will be attacked by borers and other insects and diseases.

For control of these insects Mr. Cooper recommends spraying with toxaphene or DDT, using a tablespoon of 60% emulsion concentrate of toxaphene to a gallon of water, or a tablespoon of 50% wettable DDT powder dissolved in a gallon of water.

"A number of individuals have been talking about budding native pecan trees," Mr. Cooper, a top-notch pecan man, stated. "It is too late for spring budding, as the sap is flowing too freely now and a person should wait until sometime around July 15. Budding after that date will force the bud next spring."

 Sharp knives save the home-maker much time and labor and enable her to do a better job of preparing food for the meals she

Knives may be kept in a drawer to protect the edges from becoming nicked or dulled. A wall pocket made of leather with a division for each knife is convenient to use for small knives. Knives should be thoroughly clean and dry before they are put away. If a knife is to be stored very long without being used, the blade should be coated with heavy oil, paraffin or lard to prevent rusting. If lard is used, be sure it is free of salt. Knives should always be used for the purpose intended — a bread knife for bread, or a meat knife for meat. Never use them for cutting wire, tin cans, wood or other hard materials. Do not use them for screw drivers or to pry open a lid. A knife may be broken by using it for heavier work than was intended. A cutting board should be used to protect a knife. Do not let a knife soak in water, as this will rust it. Keep handles very tight, and if a handle wears out, replace it before the blade is ruined. There are several types of sharpeners for knives. These include: a grindstone, a butcher's steel, other sharpening stones, and various small patent knife sharpeners. Any of these are very satisfactory for sharpening the knives

Requirements Of Social Security Coverage Given

"You must have social security credits for a certain length of time in order to qualify for benefits," reminded R. R. Tuley, Jr., of the Abilene Social Security Office.

"Because at one time only six quarters of coverage were required, many persons erroneously believe that only six quarters of coverage are required to insure anyone now and in the future," Tuley said.

Usually, a person will be fully insured at the time of retirement age, total disability, or death if at that time he has a quarter of coverage (earned at any time after 1936) for each two full calendar quarters after 1950. A person can never become fully insured with less than six quarters of coverage; and no matter what his date of birth, he will never need more than 40 quarters of coverage to be fully insured. A quarter of coverage corres-

ponds generally with a calendar quarter of a year.

A special provision applies to persons who reach retirement age or die before October 1, 1960. In these cases a person is fully insured if he has quarters of coverage in all but four of the quarters after 1954.

A Laundry Problem

Heavily soiled clothes that don't come clean with regular washing are problems to many. How do we remove signs of leftover soils—a question often asked by Special presoaking, suited to soil and fabric, makes for much easier washing. Soak greasy overalls and cotton work shirts for 15 to 20 minutes in hot sudsy water containing a half cup of household ammonia. For convenience soak in the tub of the washer, then spin or wring out clothes and wash.

Oversoiled cotton slip covers, curtains and play clothes may be soaked for 10 to 20 minutes in warm water, or in warm water containing a detergent or non-precipitating water softener. Use one-half to one tablespoon of either substance for each gallon of water. Whenever possible, it pays to wash clothes before dirt is ground in and difficult to remove.
