Bronte, Tex., Oct. 25.—A proposition to dam the Colorado riv er, four miles southwest of this city, will be made next Tuesday afternoon to the people of Bronte Robert Lee, Miles, Rowena, and Ballinger by Charles M. Stanley of Houston, who will address the people of those communities at the opera house in Bronte at 2 o'elock.

Mr. Stanley has completed 'all his preliminaries and is now ready to put the question up to the people. He has spent eighteen months with a corps of fourteen engineers surveying the country and has esti mated that the cost of the project will be over \$4,000,000. 




