"December 12, 1913. Hon, C. P. Shepherd,

"County Attorney, "Ballinger, Texas.

"Dear Sir: in your communication of the 2nd inst., you submit the following question:

'Is Section 1, Chapter 175, General Laws of the 33rd Legislature, applicable to female clerks working in dry goods stores and grocery

This section provides in part as

"No female shall be employed in any manufacturing or mercantile institution engaged in the manufacture of clothing, shirts, overalls, jumpers, or ladies garments or any mercantile establishment for more than fiftyfour hours during any one

"A mercantile institution or es tablishment is a place where merchandise is bought or sold. The term mercandise is very extended in its meaning, and may include every article of traffic, whether foreign or domestic, which is properly embraced in a commercial regulation. A merchant is one whose business it is to buy and sell merchandise, not incidentally or occasionally, but habitually. The term merchant has been held to include a person who keeps and sells groceries. 




