AUTO FIRE TRUCK FOR BALLINGER

At the regular meeting of the City Council Tuesday of this week a move was put on foot looking to the reduction of the fire insurance rate. It recently developed that Ballager property owners were paying a higher rate than some forty-odd towns in Texas in the same class, and upon investigation it was shown that this difference was due to the fact that the insurance companies doing business in Ballinger failed to make a re port showing the number of fires. the aggregate loss, etc. This mat ter will be taken up with the local agencies and it is expected that the report will be forthcoming.

Another matter that was dis cussed in the council meeting, and which will be put through as soon as possible, is a proposition to sell the fire team and truck and re place same with a modern auto fire truck. The mayor was au thorized to advertise the team and truck for sale, and as soon as a buyer can be found an order will be placed for the auto truck.


