

### PRACTICAL BAKING



COOKIES AND TEA CAKES In this lesson I will give a few choice recipes for co and small tea cakes. There are two kinds of cookies, rolled cooky and the drop cooky. The rolled cooky is rolled out and cut in shapes for the oven. The dropped cooky is less trouble as they are dropped with a teaspoon into the buttered pan. There is nothing more convenient for chil-dren's lunches than cookies or small cakes.

nevada Brigge

Peanut Cookies

14 cup butter cup sugar l egg, beaten light 2 tablespoonfuls milk I cup flour 4 teaspoonful salt I level teaspoonful K C Baking Powder

34 cup shelled peanuts Sift together, three times, the flour, salt and baking powder. Cream the butter; add sugar, egg, milk, the flour mixture and, lastly, the peanuts, chopped and pounded fine in a mor tar, or put through the food chopper. Drop on a buttered tin, a teaspoonful in a place well apart in order that the cooky can round out. Put half a nut meat on each bit of dough. Bake in a moderate oven. This will make twenty-four cookies.

These are delicious after the second day and will remain moist for a number of days.

Plain Cookies

1 cup granulated sugar 1/2 cup butter 1 egg, beaten light nutmeg, grated 4 cups flour 34 cup milk 3 level teaspoonfuls K C Baking Powder

Sugar for dredging the cakes Sift together, three times, the flour and baking powder. Cream the butter, nutmeg, the oven. Never try to bake cookies in beaten egg, milk, and the flour mixture. Take the dough on a floured board, a little at a time; knead lightly; roll to a scant half inch thickness and cut into rounds. Dredge with sugar by turning top of cooky into a plate of sugar; if desired, a little cinnamon may be mixed with the sugar. Bake in a moderate oven.

Almond Drop Cookies

2 eggs, beaten light nces chocolate, melted 1 cup flour 1 1/2 cups blanched almonds, chopped. I level teaspoonful K C Baking Powder 34 teaspoonful each, salt and cinnamon

1 teaspoonful vanilla extract Sift together, three times, the flour, salt, cinnamon and baking powder. To the eggs add the sugar, chocolate, almonds, extract and lastly, the flour mixture. Drop by teaspoonfuls upon a buttered baking pan. Bake in a moderate oven. The recipe makes about three dozen little cakes. Other nuts, as hick- time. Things to Remember

The softer cookies are mixed the ighter and more moist they will be. To handle soft dough for rolling and cutting, take only a small amount on the board at a time.

When very soft dough is to be rolled and cut, always add a little baking powder to flour used on the molding board and the rolling pin, as the flour alone will toughen the dough.

To bake cookies use a sheet or a shallow pan and always bake at the top of a deep pan. The heat must get directly at the cooky from the sides as well as the top. If one does not have a shallow pan or cooky sheet, invert a dripping pan and use the bottom of it. Have moderate oven for cookies.

To bake Tea Cakes always use the slow oven until the cakes have doubled in bulk. Then bake until done with the hotter oven. If tea cakes "mountain up" and crack open it is an indication they baked too quickly.



By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine Some folks think that only "colored mammies" can cook chicken, but a trial of this famous chicken pot pie disproves that assertion. Every member of the



K C Chicken Pot Pie, Baked Dumplings One fowl cut in joints; ¼ cup flour; ¼ teaspoonful salt; black pepper; 2 cups flour; 3 level teaspoonfuls K C Baking Powder; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 1/4 cus

Cover the fowl with boiling water and let simmer until tender, then remove to a baking dish. Mix the 1/4 cup flour, salt and black pepper with cold water to a smooth paste and use to thicken the broth. Remove the fat from the top of the broth if necessary before adding the thickening. Pour this gravy over the fowl, until it is nearly covered, and reserve the rest to serve apart. Sift together the flour, baking powder and salt, three times; into this work the shorten. ing and use cream or milk to make a dough, less stiff than for biscuits. Put this by spoonfuls over the fowl in the dish, which it should rest upon and completely cover. Let bake about 35

When young, tender chickens are scarce, this presents a most satisfactory way of serving old fowls. Veal or lamb prepared in this manner is more appetizing than when served as a stew.


