the president in Mexico, and af ter the president and Secretary Bryan had conferred for an hour with John Lind, personal representative of the president in Mexico, and after a two hour cabinet meeting, during which dispatches from Charge O'Shaugh nessy revealed that the Huerta government disputed the right of American Bluejackets to be ashore at Tampico and contended that its recent public statement of apology was ample.

Immediately after the cabinet meetinf abjourned, Secretary Daniels issued his order to the Atlantic fleet, and wirless messages flashed up and down the Atlantic coast, to put the fleet under steam for Tampico.

It will be the largest fighting force the American government has assembled for possible action since the Spanish American War. Twenty-six warships and 21,000 men will comprise the force off Tampico.

A New Way of Using Left Overs By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine Every housewife finds the disposition of left overs a most perplexing problem. K C Beef Roll will go a long ways toward helping you out when the family get tired of hash and stews. You really ought to try it for supper tonight or tomorrow night at the



latest.

Beef Roll, K C Style Three cups flour, 1 teaspoonful salt; 3 level tea-spoonfuls K C Baking Powder; 4 cup shortening; sweet milk; 1 cup each, chipped cooked beef and ham; 1 teaspoonful mixed mustard; 2 beaten eggs; grating of onion; 4 teaspoonful each, salt and pepper; broth or water. Make a biscuit dough of the flour,


salt, K C baking powder, shortening and milk, and roll into a sheet half an inch thick, having the ends even. Mix the other ingredients by themselves, using liquid as needed to make a paste. Spread the paste over the dough and roll like a jelly roll. Bake in a buttered pan about forty minutes. Brush over the outside with a little beaten egg left for the purpose and return to the oven to brown. Serve hot with a rich brown sauce. Other meats, such as chicken or veal, alone, or in combination, may be used. The onion and mustard may be omitted.
