Millions Lost In Big Flood

By United Press: DETROIT, May 13.—Flood damage in Michigan during the last forty-eight hours' rainfall, will total millions.

Two have been reported dead as a result of the heavy floods over this state. Others have been reported missing and hundreds are homeless. Thousands have been marooned in the low lands.

Ascertain Truth of Parks' Death

By United Press: WASHINGTON, May 13.—Stirred by reports that Private Parks an orderly to Colonel Taggart of the Twenty-eighth Infantry of the Fifth Brigade, now serving at Vera Cruz, was tortured and executed by the federals, both the state and war departments today took steps to ascertain the truth.

Secretary of War Garrison instructed General Funston to get information from General Maas, regarding Parks' fate. The state department asked the Brazilian minister at Mexico City to obtain similar information from General Huerta.

It is intimated that drastic measures will be taken if the report of torture to death is confirmed.

Secretary of War Garrison said, "If polite, decent measures fail, then we will take the next step."

Not Known Whether Silliman Has Been Released from Prison

By United Press: VERA CRUZ, May 13.—Conflicting reports have been brought here by Americans in regard to Vice Consul Silliman, who is said to be in prison at Saltillo. Consul Canada here received word from the Brazilian minister at Mexico City that Dictator Huerta had informed him that Silliman had been released.

It is also reported that Silliman might, but a dozen American families, but a dozen American families who were imprisoned with the vice consul at Saltillo, reached here declare that Silliman is still in jail and held incommunicado.

Archbishop Mora Del Rio, head of the Catholic church in Mexico, here expects to sail shortly for Rome. He left the capital secretly but denied that he fled from Dictator Huerta.

Bishop Mora tried to persuade Huerta to resign for the good of the country.

Tampico May Fall Before Rebels Today

By United Press: WASHINGTON, May 13.—Tampico will likely fall today, according to a wireless received here by the United States government from Admiral Mayo.

Heavy firing has continued at Tampico since midnight, the dispatch says. Mayo said the rebels confidently expected to capture the city today and added "general impression their expectation will be realized."

By United Press: JUAREZ, Mex., May 13.—Miss Ida Hays, an American Baptist missionary of the Madero Institute, of the western extremity of Saltillo, is in grave danger of losing her life when General Villa is attacking the city, according to reports reaching here. She refused to leave her mission when other noncombatants went to the British legation for protection.

ROSE IS 'PUT THROUGH' TODAY

By United Press: NEW YORK, May 13.—"Bald Jack" Rose, who is a star witness for the state in the second trial of Lieutenant Charles Becker charged with instigating the murder of Herman Rosenthal, a gambler, was put under the severest cross examination today by Becker's Counsel Manton. The witness, however, stuck to incriminating direct evidence.
