

K C Lady Baltimore Cake One cup butter; 2 cups granulated

sugar; 1 cup milk; 1 teaspoonful rose water; 3½ cups flour; 3 level teaspoon-fuls K C Baking Powder; whites of 6 eggs, beaten dry.
