Says Battle 880 Million **Field Is Bushels** of Wheat the Place

By United Press: WASHINGTON, May 23.-The United States Agricutural Department, figuring on the reports made from the entire grain growing section, estimates that a bumper wheat crop will be produced this be the battle ground. This was year. Total production of crop is expected to reach 880,000,000 bushels.

The large yield is the result of the combination of largest acreage and the promise of largest yield in per acre in many years. The department has not received a single unfavorable report from the wheat growing states.
