MAYES SAYS PRESS IS UNIVERSITY

WICHITA FALLS, Tex., June 19.—"The press has become the University of the people, the journalists, their teachers," said Will H. Mayes, dean of the University of Texas School of Journalism, in an address before the Texas Press Association convention here today.

"Newspapers came to take up public education where the schools have left off and to continue that education throughout the mature lives of men and women.

"That the newspapers influence has not always been exercised in the right direction that it has too often been for the bad, is due to the fact that the country's educators have been slow to appreciate fully the tremendous power of the press, and for that reason have neglected to give attention to proper training of those who, as journalists, really become the post graduate teachers and the leaders of public thought. Perhaps it is stranger still that the press itself has been last to recognize and to admit the need for professional education for newspapermen."

Dean Mayes pledged the policy of the University School of Journalism was "to turn from the university directly to the people men and women equipped for newspaper work." Higher ideals in the profession was another stated object.

WILL ENLARGE CULVERTS FOR CITY'S STORM WATERS

Culverts on the Abilene and Southern railway's right-of-way from Fifth Street to Eleventh, will be enlarged and placed in a condition for the drainage of water coming from the north western part of the city. Heretofore, complaints have been heard from not only the section of the city in the vicinity of the Abilene and Southern railway, but also from many residents in the central portion of the city along the Santa Fe right-of-way. It is believed that if the several culverts, one or two being at the intersection of each street and the railroad tracks, are enlarged, water will run off the city's street and residents' lots.

For the purpose of coming to this decision, Percy Jones, engineer of the Abilene and Southern railway, was in the city yesterday from Abilene where he makes his offices. He went over the territory that should be drained properly, with the street committee of the city of Ballinger, composed of John A. Weeks, Will Ellis and C. C. Coekrell. Mr. Weeks is absent from the city, but Councilmen Coekrell and Ellis undertook to show Engineer Jones the necessity of an enlargement of the culverts at an early date. In many places about the part of

the city, commonly known as the flats, water from the rain of the first part of the week, is still on the ground and it is believed that there is little chance of its drying within the next several days.

It was pointed out to Mr. Jones by the street committee that danger of sickness from the standing of pools of water was sufficient demand that the railway make arrangement to carry off the storm water of the city in the manner in which it should. Mr. Jones after examining the conditions prevailing along the right-of-way and realizing the opportunity for the breeding of dangerous insects, stated that he would recommend that the concern enlarge all culverts. It is believed that the storm water question will be solved then for the entire city, since if ample facilities are given the overflow waters from the hill, in the lower section of the city, for its drainage, there will be no pools of water standing here and there in the central part of the city or that part along the Santa Fe right-of-way.

The Abilene and Southern railway will commence work on the culverts, it has been stated, within the very near future.

Mix the Breakfast Biscuits the Night Before—

Set Them Away in a Cool Place and Bake them Fresh in the Morning

The dough will remain in a partly leavened condition for hours and when put in the oven will come up just as light and fluffy as if freshly mixed.

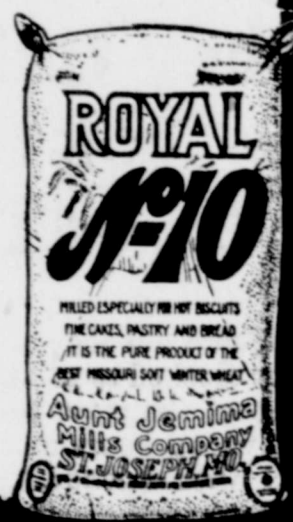

It will indicate the United State's intention to let the civil war in Mexico be fought to the bitter end.

In America we have taken up the systematic education of the people to greater individual thrift, knowing that without that, our municipal, state and national affairs will not be run on thrift lines. One of the purposes of our society was to learn from inquiry in foreign countries, and I have observed and learned much which I hope may be nationally useful in America. The physical condition of the men, the longer and more specialized school system and the co-operative buying and selling, are aspects of German thrift which will repay our study. A definite and systematic effort must be made in America to teach the benefits of the household garden, as well as how to make one, and in doing this learn handicraft, which otherwise city boys do not learn. The urban population must get back to the land, and this is the best and quickest way to bring about the change."
