# **Crop Worth About 3 Million Dollars**

The 1958 peanut crop is expected to total nearly 1,000,000 bushels in Eastland County, the best in many years, according to officials of purchasing agencies. The crop, which is virtually all harvested, is worth approximately \$3,000,000 in money

Ross Wilson of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association at Gorman has estimated that the county crop would total about 30 bushels per acre for 32,000 acres planted - 960,000 bushels. He said the price would average from \$3 to \$3.15 per bushel.

Virtually all storage facilities in the county are full, Wilson reported. He said that 12,000 tons are in storage at Gorman, an Eastland has some 1,000 ton stored. All space has been take at Ranger and Rising Star.

Mr. Wilson described the 195 crop as better than the bumpe crop of 1950 because the per acr

were more acres planted to pea nuts in 1950. Eastland Count is exceeded in Texas only by Co manche County in the total num ber of bushels produced. Coman che plants more land to peanut than this county.

Officials estimated that le than 5% of the 1958 crop remain to be marketed. Rainy weather delayed the beginning of the harvest but open weather in recent weeks was favorable. The peanut ay crop was good. the excellent peanut crop has resulted in good business conditions for cities of the county and area. Merchants reported record business volumes during December in most places. The outlook for 1959 is about the same as the past year, depending on moisture conditions. The agriculture department has set the 1959 peanut planting allotment at the minimum level permitted by farm law - the same as 1958. Texas' share of the 1,-610,000 national allotment will be 356,004 acres in 1959 - slightly higher than 1958.

## **Technical School** Is Available For Air Force Men

# **Apply** Early For Social Security,

Manager Suggests Would you like to get your st social security check as soon

possible after entitlement? .ou can help the social security ffice get your money to you earier by applying beforehand and by getting the proofs needed to-gether, according to R. R. Tuley, Jr., social security district manager in Abilene.

Tuley advised that all persons intending to retire get in touch with the social security office one or two months before actual retirement. They should bring with them the papers necessary to es-tablish their rights to benefits. These include the social security card, proof of age, and proof of recent earnings, such as the last

W-2 form or last income tax re-turn, with Schedule C or Schedule F and the cancelled check with which the salf-employment tax was paid. If the retiring per-son's wife is 62, she should bring proof of her age. Also, if there are any children under 18, their birth or baptismal certificates, or other proof of age, should be furnished.

Severely disabled persons ap-plying for freeze of social security status, if under 50, or for disability payment, if 50 or over, should bring information about medical examinations and treatment and employment for the past several vears.

In death cases proof of age is needed for all eligible children, widows over 62, and dependent Widows eligible for parents. monthly benefits must furnish proof of marriage. Proof of death must be obtained in all cases.

Horw rs Questions w Q - I want to buy a house and have never had a GI home loa. I understand that the first step is to get a Certificate of Eligibility. where do I get mat?

---

A - The Certificate of Eligioniy is issued by the Regional offof the Veterans Administraon in the area where the house ou are interested in is located. Application may be made in person or by mail, and your original discharge, or photostatic copy, accompanied by a statement that the original discharge has been lost, will be needed as eviden e. Q - Is there a deadline for filing a claim for disability com-

A - There is no deadline. A However, an eligible veteran applying within a year from the date of his release from service may have his payments back-dated to the day following his re-lease from service. A veteran who applies after he has been out of service one year may be paid only from the date his application was filed.

Q - Can a disabled Korea veteran getting military retired pay receive vocational rehabilitation training from VA?

A - Yes. Receipt of military retired pay does not affect the eligibility of a Korea veteran with service connected disability to take vocational rehabilitation training. He must, however, need the training to overcome his handicap; His discharge must have been under conditions other than dishonorable: and his disability onorable; and his disability must be such as would entitle him to VA compensation if he were not receiving military retired


Q - I have a Korean GI term insurance policy. Is it possible to convert it to a permanent plan of insurance?

A - If your policy number is eded by the initials "RS", it will be possible to convert to a permanent plan after January 1,

Q - I understand VA benefit checks can now be forwarded by the Post Office. Is this automatic, or do veterans have to give some sort of notice if they move? A - Veterans still must give notice. They must file a regular change-of-address form with their local Post Office. And they still should notify VA, so the agency can keep its records

### Raisin-Pecan Timbales With Hot Lemon Sauce

You'll want to show off these dessert timbales because they look so clever with the bits of toasted pecaus and plump raisins in beautiful, color contrast to the sawiy white timbales. The lemon sauce is easy to make and oh, so pretty, served hot over the Raisin-Pecan Timbales. Minute Stacks

RAISIN-PECAN TIMBALES WITH HOT LEMON SAUCE Ingredients for Timbales: 2 cups water 1 teaspeon salt 1 cup uncooked white rice 1/2 cup best or cane sugar 1/2 cup cooked raisins 1/2 cup cooked raisins

- 1/2 cup coarsely chopped
- toasted pecans 1/2 pt. (1 cup) chilled
- whipping cream 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Ingredients for Lemon Sauce:

1 cup beet or cane sugar 2 tablespoons cornstarch 14 teaspoon salt • 11/2 cups boiling water 3 tablespoons lemon juice

2 teaspoons grated lemon rind

METHOD FOR MAKING TIM-BALES: Put the water, salt and rice into a 2-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible

Cover and leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Turn the heat off. Leave lid of for 10 minutes. Stir the sugar into the hot rice. Chill the rice. Told in the raisins and the pecans. It is important that the pecans are toasted. Do this by placing the pecans on a greased shallow pan in a 350° oven for 10 minutes, or until browned. Whip the cream and stir in the vanilla, Fold the whipped cream into the chilled rice mixture.

Use a wet custard cup for me ing the timbales. Press the rice into the custard cup and then unmold by running a traile around the edge of the custand cup and shaking out the tim-bales. Cover and store in the refrigerator until time to serve. To serve, garnish the top of each timbale with a toested pe can and serve with the bo lemon sauce.

This recipe makes 6 timbeles if a custard cup holding 2/3 of s cup is used for molding.

METHOD FOR MAKING THE LEMON SAUCE: Mix together the sugar, cornstarch and salt in a saucepan. Slowly stir in the boiling water. Cook over a med-ium heat stirring constantly, un-til clear and thick. Stir in the lemon julce and lemon rind. If desired, color with yellow food coloring. Serve hot over the Raisin-Pecan Timbales.
