Election news from over the entire state of Texas is something of a big nature. It costs thousands of dollars to gather returns from the hundred thousand precincts of Texas.

Heretofore, it has been customary by the papers of this part of the state to gather only partial returns. This year, however, THE DAILY LEDGER will be in a position through the Texas Co-Opera. tive Election Bureau of Dallas to serve all of Central West Texas with the latest election news. No other paper of this part of the state will be as complete as the Sunday morning edition of THE DAILY LEDGER.

It has been customary in past years for drug stores, hotels, pool constituionalists will be opened halls, confectioneries and other public places to receive partial election returns, through the telegraph and telephone companies. The result of all was that the newspapers were unable to gather complete and accurate returns. This year ONLY the newspapers of enterprise will be able to furnish election news.


