Officials are working tonight with the hope of confining the war to only Austria and Servia and not involve the whole of Europe.

The temptation was too strong for them to halt, and they moved right on up the hill to the battery of five pieces frowning down upen them and scattering destruction in their midst. Under the deadly fire the Texans succeeded in driving the Zucaves beyond guns. 
