



For the past several days he has been giving his wife the closest attention, being by her side the greater portion of the time that he could spare away from his office. On account of the gravity of the European situation, he has been laboring under heavy burdens. Today he cancelled all engagements after having kept an all night's vigil.

The president, always sensitive about exaggerated reports concerning members of his family, authorized no announcement about Mrs. Wilson's health.

Three weeks ago she seemed to rally and was well enough to walk, supported by a nurse, in the white house grounds.

For several days it had been known that Mrs. Wilson's condition was serious, but only to those in the closest touch at the white house.

One day Irst March Mrs. Wilson slipaed on a rug at the white house injuring her spine. After the operation was performed and weeks of convalescence, she finally rose from her bed. The winter's duties about her home together with charity work in the slums of the city brought on nervous prostration. Stomach trouble added to her nervous ailment and Bright's disease developed.
