
THEY SAY Germans Indicated to Occupying Brussels Today

LONDON, Aug. 20---(Official Announcement) Confirmation has been received here of the fact that the Belgian forces CUT OFF opposing the Germans in North Belgium, have been compelled to retire before the overwhelming German infantry advances.
