# Agreement Signed to Fight to Bitter End

LONDON, Sept. 5.—None of the allies will conclude with peace The war will be continued to on an individual bases of war. the bitter end.

This was the substance of an agreement signed by the British foreign minister, the French and Russian ambassador.

Francis Neilson, a member of the English parliament, and one of the group believing that England must fight as long as it is necessary, but ought to seek peace at the first honorable moment, today made a speech before the body, declaring that the English should turn to President Wilson for the establishment of peace.

Mr. Neilson in his speech said, "It ought not to be thought that President Wilson's overtures for peace fell because of his fears or his pity for the combatants. His example in the Mexican situation where his patience and deep understanding won out, has not been followed in Europe.

"The land question lies at the bottom of all our troubles in Eur ope. A few land owners make up the ruling class. They devise and administer the laws on the contin-ent and can within a very short time bring the continent into con-flagration.

It is a bitter pill to swallow, we shall assert. But why should not the United States be asked to settle the war."






