# 2,500 KIILIED BY ERRIITYUAAK

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 5.---Two thousand, five hundred persons were killed, and thousands were injured in an earthquake which wrecked Isbarta and Burdur, in Asiatic Turkey late Saturday night.
Isbarta and Burdur are centers for the manufacturing of carpets in Asiatic Turkey, many of the finest rugs coming from that point to be distributed over the world.
LONDON, Oct. 5.--The province of Konia in Asiatic Turkey, was shaken by a severe earthquake Saturday, according to news which has been received in this city.

Two towns have been destroyed by the quake.
A great loss of life is reported in the messages.
