## OLD MYSTERY OF MURDER IS STILL PUZZLING THEM

By United Press: LOS ANGELES, Oct. 17. -Scientists are trying today to pene trate the oldest murder mystery of the Pacific Coast. The crime, according to the investigators, was committed thousands of years ago. Naturally the names of the principals are not known. The only evidence is the skeletion of a woman which was found in the famous La Brae asphaltum pits near Los Angeles, where paleontologists have unearthed the bones of prehistoric horses, sabre-toothed tigers, and other beasts.
