



COTTON TO ENGLAND TEXAS CITY, Nov. 12.—One of the largest cotton cargoes to be shipped to Liverpool this season left here yesterday enroute to that port. The product was on board the steamer "Inkum" and consisted of 15,400 bales of Texas grown staple, valued at approximately \$525,000.
