Cover crop planting season is upon us. Many drills are already running. Winter cover crops are one of our most profitable conservation practices in this area. The soil, in order to produce an economical return, must be protected from the elements and have a continuous supply of organic material for maintaining soil tilth. Winter cover crops fulfill these two needs.

On the sandy land rye is primarily used for protection from wind erosion. Vetch is used in combination with rye to add nitrogen and provide a higher quality of organic material for returning to the land. Vetch and rye has been a great help in maintaining peanut yields in the area since vetch was introduced here on a large scale some twelve to fourteen years ago.

While Vetch has been most popular on sandy land it does give good results on the heavier soils when it is used primarily as a soil improving and grazing crop. Where land is used for harvesting of small grains, vetch interfers with combining and must be separated from the grain after harvest.

Results similar to use of vetch can be obtained through proper use of fertilizer on small grain land.

In recent years commercial nitrogen fertilizer has become so cheap and so easy to apply that it may possibly be cheaper to apply nitrogen than to use a legume like vetch with small grain.

Relatively heavy use of nitrogen fertilizer on small grain for growing a heavy stubble and the use of commercial nitrogen for devaying small grain residue can

do much for raising the organic content of small grain land. With Continued good weather for drilling cover crops, fields should be a beautiful green within a few weeks.





P. Cole, armers Home Administration ounty supervisor, pointed out this week.

His agency is authorized to inare farm real estate loans that re made from funds advanced banks, insurance companies, or ther institutions having money) invest. Since the recent change the money market, activity by vestors has greatly increased. During the past six months, the ational monthly volume of new nsured loan business has risen rom approximately \$1,250,000 to 5,000,000 a month.

For either a direct or indirect loan the farmer pays 41/2 percent interest. If the loan is insured. the lender of investor gets a clear 3½ percent and the Government guarantees payment of both the principal and interest.

The full guarantee and the money market change have put local banks in position to many contribute to a stronger local agriculture by helping farmers

otherwise unable to buy or improve their farms.

After a 5-year period the pri-vate lender may sell the insured note to the Government for the amount of principal and interest due, may arrange for later sale, or may hold until the note is fully repaid. 
